PHYSICAL SCIENCE AWARDS – 2010

(PHYSICS/MATHEMATICS/COMPUTER SCIENCE/STATISTICS)

Applications are invited from undergraduate students or recent graduates who have completed research project (individual) in the field of Physics or Computer Science or Mathematics or Statistics as a partial requirement for B.Sc. degree in a Sri Lankan University during the period from 1st July 2009 to 30th June 2010.

APPLICATION PROCEDURE:

1. The project should have been carried out as an undergraduate research project (individual) in Physics or Mathematics or Compute Science or Statistics as a partial requirement for the B.Sc. degree.
2. The duly completed prescribed application should be submitted together with a synopsis of the work with not more than 1500 words, along with the full project report.
3. The Head of the Department where the work was carried out must certify the report. This certification should state that the project is the sole work of the applicant and that in constitutes a partial requirement for the B.Sc. degree.
4. The report should be submitted in duplicate and should reach the following address **on or before 7th September 2010:**

5. Short listed candidates will be invited to make oral presentations which will be part of the evaluation process of the award.
6. Write on the top-left-hand-corner of the envelop “Physical Science Award 2010”

1. SLAAS expect that the awards will be made on high quality submissions, therefore, reserve the rights not to award any if the quality of submissions does not demonstrate the expected quality.
2. The decision of the SLAAS Council shall be final on any matter related to awards.
3. If any award is won, the cheque will be drawn in favor or the applicant as given in cage 1 of the prescribed application from.

PRESENTATION OF AWARDS:

Awards will be presented at the Annual Sessions of the SLAAS in December 2010.
